ety of North Dakota,

"Ronald Reagan Minuteman Missile State Historic Site actually consists of two sites telling the story of the Cold War years in North Dakota. They are the Oscar-Zero Missile Alert Facility and the November-33 Launch Facility. They are the last remnants of the 321st Missile Wing, a cluster of intercontinental ballistic missile launch sites that were spread over a 6,500-square-mile area around the Grand Forks Air Force Base. The Oscar Zero Launch Control Center and the November-33 Missile Facility played an integral part in the Cold War in North Dakota and the world. This site is the last launch control center intact with the top-side of November 33 missile facility left intact."

We started our tour of Oscar-Zero, which is located four miles north of Cooperstown on Highway 45. The topside facilities allowed us a glimpse into how the personnel assigned there lived and worked together, both above and below ground. Down the elevator, we saw the underground Launch Control Center, where the final command would have been given to start a launch. We then drove out to November-33, located two miles east of Cooperstown on Highway 200, where we took the self-guided tour of the topside of the launch facility. The Massive launch doors and security and electronic fencing are exactly as it was during its use.

Back in Carrington, the Installation dinner and ceremony was held at the Chieftain restaurant, where Past Region 7 President Don Rogers installed the unit's 2012 slate of officers. Take the reins from outgoing President Vern Zink were Bev Zink as President, 1st Vice President Don Thomson, and 2nd Vice President Allan Towles; holding their jobs as Secretary and Treasurer are Alene Bailey and Lillian Thomson, respectively. Unit Trustees are Vern Zink, Rose Larson, Cathy Ruebel and Larry Ruebel.

Following breakfast, Vern led the group in a Sunday morning reflection. With good-byes said, everyone headed out for home and a
